Re: Request for Access to Information under Part II of the Access to Information and Protection Privacy Act (the ATIPP Act, 2015)

On October 25, 2019, the City of St. John's received your request for access to the following information:

Requesting a copy of the report written by Nick Falvo for End Homelessness St. John's.

There are two relevant reports being completed on behalf of End Homelessness St. John's:

- The 2014-2019 Community Plan Assessment, with an expected publication being made available in 3-5 weeks.
- The 2019-2024 Community Plan to End Homelessness in St. John's. This plan is scheduled to be approved by the Community Advisory Board, comprised of several community organizations, in the next 5-7 weeks, with a final publication date later this fall.

Upon their completion and approval by the Board, both reports will be made available online. As both reports have not been finalized but will be published once they are, I have withheld the records under sections 22 and 35 of the ATIPPA:

Published material

- 22.** (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose a record or part of a record that
(b) is to be published or released to the public within 30 business days after the applicant's request is received.

Disclosure harmful to the financial or economic interests of a public body

- 35.** (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose to an applicant information which could reasonably be expected to disclose
(d) information, the disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to result in the premature disclosure of a proposal or project or in significant loss or gain to a third party;

Please be advised that you may ask the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review the processing of your access request, as set out in Section 42 of the ATIPP Act. A request to the Commissioner must be made in writing within 15 business days of the date of this letter or within a longer period that may be allowed by the Commissioner:

You may also appeal directly to the Supreme Court Trial Division within 15 business days after you receive the decision of the public body, pursuant to Section 52 of the Act.
